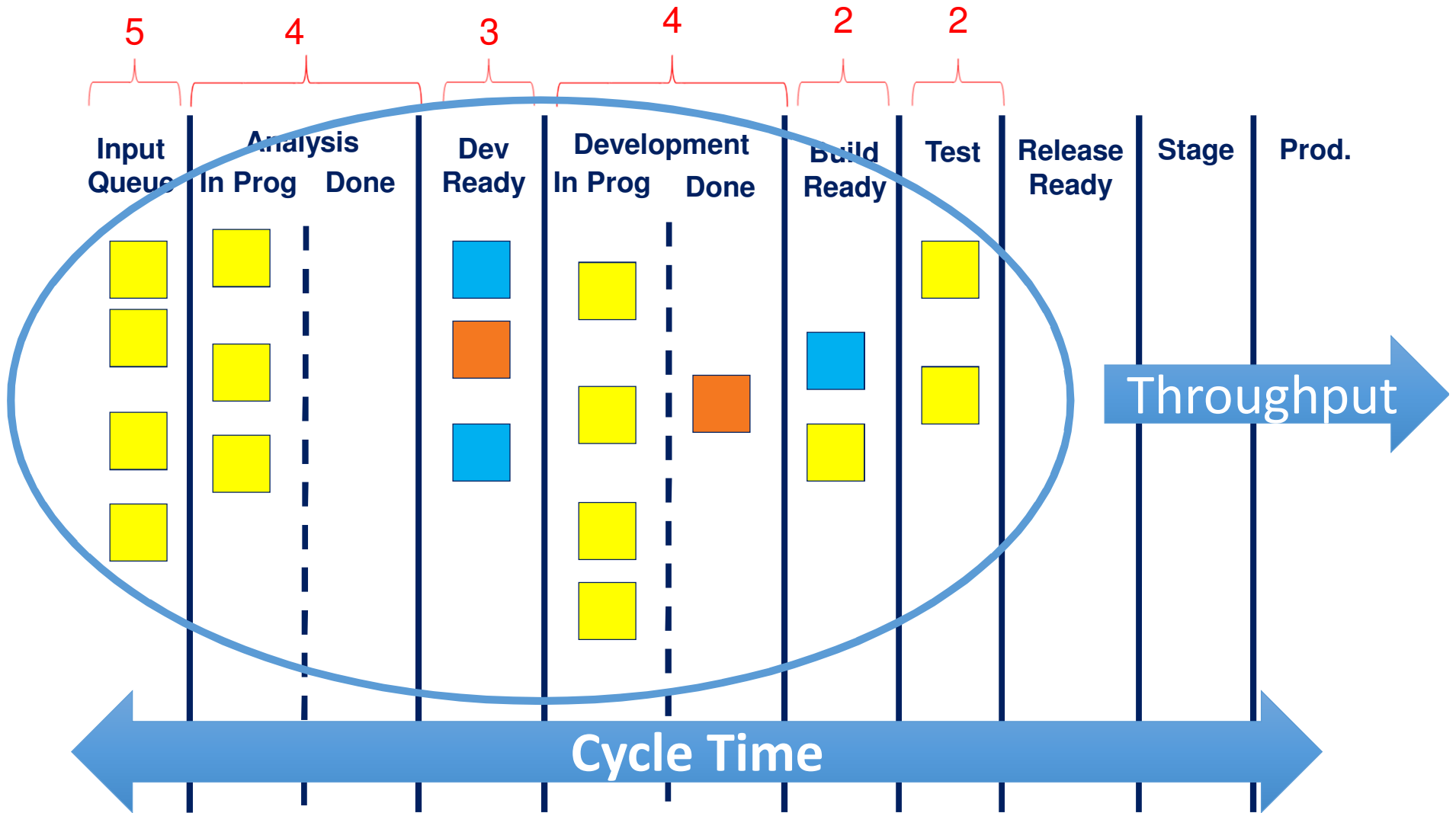

Example Kanban board simulation

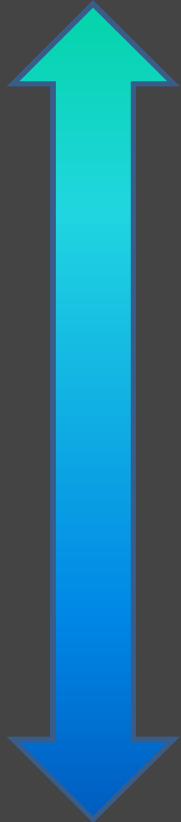
